The ACT is more subject-oriented with 4 sections: English, Math, Reading and Science Reasoning, plus an optional essay section. The SAT is composed of 3 parts: Reading, Math and Writing. Since most schools that require standardized test scores will accept either the SAT or ACT, students should keep an open mind about what test to take. Differences in content on the two tests allow for some generalizations:

Students who do better on the SAT typically:	Students who do better on the ACT typically:
Enjoy brain teasers or riddles	Enjoy science, economics or debate
Don't have to study to pass tests	Work hard in school to earn good grades
Are "street smart"	Are "book smart"
Are good at reading between the lines	Are good writers
Have great vocabularies	Can deal with a little trigonometry
